Position

The Board will support the work of Karis Community and provide mission-based leadership and strategic governance. While day-to-day operations are led by Karis' Executive Director (E.D.), the Board/E.D. relationship is a partnership, and the appropriate involvement of the Board is both critical and expected. Service on Karis' Board of Directors is without remuneration.

Specific Board Member responsibilities include:

Leadership, governance, and oversight

- Serve as a trusted advisor to the E.D. as she develops and implements Karis' strategic plan.
- Partner with the E.D. and other Board Members to complete strategic plan.
- Review agenda and supporting materials before board meetings.
- Approve Karis' annual budget, audit reports, and business decisions.
- Contribute to a yearly performance evaluation of the E.D.
- Assist the E.D. and Board President in identifying and recruiting new Board Members.
- Act as an ambassador for the organization.
- Ensure Karis' commitment to a diverse board and staff reflects the communities Karis serves.

Fundraising

- Consider philanthropy a priority, making a yearly contribution commensurate with financial capacity.
- Regularly review personal networks to identify potential donors, in-kind donors, and sponsors.
- Promote and encourage participation in events and campaigns.

Board terms/participation

Karis' Board Members will serve a three-year term to be eligible for re-appointment for one additional term. Ten (10) board meetings are held each year.
